THE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE

DOG AND CAT QUARANTINE STATION

Rules of Quarantine

1. If an animal(s) is permitted by the Inspector to enter the country for quarantining, it will be taken directly to the Quarantine Station, Havelock Street, Curepe under supervision of a quarantine guard appointed by the Veterinary Inspector. The cost of transportation is borne by the owner.
2. The owner shall absolve Government from any responsibility for death, illness, loss or injury during the time that the animals are in quarantine. Owners must disclose any pre-existing conditions that may require special attention in quarantine.
3. Fractious or intractable animals which pose a threat to the safety of quarantine personnel or visitors will be euthanised or re-exported.
4. The owner shall be responsible for providing the quantity and kind of food preferred together with feeding instructions for his animal. ***Because of concerns about quality control, the introduction and spread of diseases, storage and the odor associated with cooked food only commercial (dried or canned) pet food is permitted.***
5. The quarantine fee \$20.00 / day (30 day quarantine) or \$10.00 / day (> 30 days quarantine) must be paid in cash and a receipt presented before the animal is released from quarantine. In cases of default in respect of fees or that food is not provided, the animal(s) may be sold at a public auction (subject to all quarantine liabilities being met) or destroyed.
6. Veterinary attention to the animal shall be the sole responsibility of the Veterinary Officer in charge, the cost of the drugs, biologicals and materials being borne by the owner. Vaccination against Distemper, Infectious Canine Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Rabies and Parvovirus in the case of dogs may be carried out on the entry of animals into the Station at the owner's expense. The cost of Rabies antibody testing if required will be at the owner's expense. An owner may request, during an illness of an animal that a veterinary practitioner be permitted to enter, as a consultant to the Veterinary Officer in charge. This cost is borne by the owner.
7. Visiting privileges shall be restricted to the owner of the animal or one person designated by the owner and approved by the Veterinary Officer in charge and visits can only be made during visiting hours. The owner being the name that is issued on the import permit.
8. The owner is not permitted to bring friends or family members into quarantine to visit their animals unless it is the one person designated to visit. Therefore, each kennel would only be allowed a maximum of two persons during visiting hours.
9. If an owner brings another person (s) to visit, other than the name submitted, that person will not be allowed entry into quarantine.
10. Children will not be permitted into quarantine unless they are designated visitors.
11. If a kennel has more than one animal, only the owner and/or the designated visitor would be allowed entry during visiting hours at any one time.
12. Once a name is submitted as the designated visitor into quarantine, that will be the final submission accepted.
13. Visitors are only allowed to feed the animals they are approved to visit.
14. Visitors must agree to remain confined in the kennel or exercise run which must be locked. Animals may only be removed from the assigned kennel on the instructions or with the permission of the Veterinary Officer in charge of the Quarantine or the Animal Attendant on duty.
15. While the animal is in quarantine the owners or designated visitors must follow all instructions of the Veterinary Officer in charge of the Quarantine or the Animal Attendant on duty.
16. Persons who persistently ignore the rules of the quarantine or refuse to accept instructions from the Veterinary Officer in charge of the Quarantine or the Animal Attendant on duty may have their visiting privileges revoked.

17. No pregnant dog or cat will be permitted into quarantine. No dog or cat shall be bred in Quarantine. In the event of a pregnant dog or cat being unknowingly admitted into Quarantine and giving birth while in quarantine, there will be an additional charge of \$10.00 TT per puppy/kitten/day for the period in quarantine.

18. The owner shall be required to pay the following fees at the port of entry into the country.

a) Inspection Fee (payable to the Comptroller of Customs and Excise)

For every dog or cat \$10.00

b) Overtime fees (payable to the Inspector)

I. Mon - Fri 4 p.m. - 10 p.m. \$50.00

II. Mon - Fri 10 p.m. - 8 p.m. \$75.00

III. Weekends and Public Holidays \$75.00

The above fees apply to the first animal; each additional animal will be \$20.00.

19. These rules are subject to modification at the discretion of the Chief Technical Officer (Agriculture) as circumstances may dictate.
